Feedback from the alumni

- 100% of Students agree that the course content is interesting amongst them 20% strongly agree.
- them 33% strongly agree with the stakeholders. Only 17% are neutral for this question.

 This reflects the intellectual power of the students. For the remaining 17%, it was decided to convince the students to work on interesting areas for their improvement in professional competencies.
