| Feedback from the alumni | Action taken on the feedback |
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| <p>1. 100% of Students agree that the course content is interesting amongst them 20% strongly agree.</p> <p>2. The curriculum intellectually stimulates 83% amongst them 33% strongly agree with the stakeholders. Only 17% are neutral for this question.</p> <p>This reflects the intellectual power of the students.
